OUR SECOND PLAN HAS BEEN APPROVED!

We're pleased to report that Boston Big Local's second plan has been approved by Local Trust. The plan covers the period April 2017 to March 2019 (years 3 and 4 of our ten-year £1m project).

Boston is one of 150 areas across the UK to have received an award from the Big Lottery Fund. The project aims to make Boston an even better place to live by helping residents develop the skills and confidence they need to identify what matters to them, make decisions, and take action to change things for the better.

Boston Big Local Chair, Richard Tory, said: "In the first two years of the project we funded and supported a wide range of great activities that have helped to bring positive changes to the area. This was made possible through the strong links we have forged with local delivery partners.

"As well as supporting big public events such as the Beach event in Central Park, Boston in Bloom and helping with the launch of the Boston Marathon UK, we are proud to have helped smaller projects such as the Arts for Dementia support group, the Boston Community Transport scheme and swim sessions for young people."

The second Boston Big Local plan will continue to deliver activities under four themes: improving health and wellbeing; creating a more attractive environment; building community spirit; and encouraging enterprise.

SUCCESS FOR BOSTON MARATHON UK 2017

This year's Boston Marathon UK took place on Easter Monday, 17 April, and was another runaway success. The event brought many visitors to the town, raised money for local charities and benefited local businesses. It was organised by Boston Marathon Association and supported by local sponsors and volunteer marshals. Boston Big Local was the event's main sponsor.

This year a separate 3 mile/5 kilometre fun run was also organised to cater for younger and casual runners from the area. This took place alongside the marathon but as a sub-event with separate sponsorship.

In all, 406 people completed the full marathon on the day, along with 312 who completed the half marathon. 41 people took part in the fun run. 5% of the runners came from Boston, and 20% of runners were from Lincolnshire. There were also participants from across the UK and from as far away as the USA, Canada, Germany, France, Hungary, Belarus, Jordan, and India.

Congratulations to everyone who took part as a runner, an organiser, or as a volunteer marshal. Boston Big Local was proud to have been able to support Boston Marathon UK in 2017 and we look forward to seeing the event continue to grow in future years.

Lifting the lid on the Community Chest

Did you know that our Community Chest fund offers small grants of up to £1,000 to residents, community groups and charities within the Boston Big Local area? It is available to individual residents and groups who have an innovative idea which needs a cash boost to make it happen, and to charities and community groups who need some extra support to carry out their services.

Residents of any age who live within the Boston Big Local area can apply for a grant from the Community Chest as long as it meets one of our four Boston Big Local priorities, which are:

- Improving health and wellbeing
- Creating a more attractive environment
- Building community spirit
- Encouraging enterprise

How can the funding be used?

Residents, groups and charities can apply for two different funding streams:

- grants that can be used by residents and/or community groups to undertake projects, and
- funding to support running costs such as volunteer expenses for groups that meet one of our priorities.



... could you benefit?

Each Community Chest funding application must have the support of at least two people who live in the Boston Big Local area. You can check whether you are a Boston Big Local resident at **bostonbiglocal.co.uk/plan-2** where you can download a map of the area and a list of street names.

community groups and charities that have already benefited from Community Chest funding from Boston Big Local. We hope the stories of their successful bids will inspire you to complete a Community Chest application of your own.

The deadline for applications for the next round of funding is Monday 31 July 2017 at 6pm.



How to apply

Our latest Community Chest awards

£250 to **Boston Bridge Club** to help them purchase a computerised scoring system called 'Bridgemate'. The club encourages and fosters bridge playing in Boston.

£690 to Butterfly Hospice Trust for volunteer training expenses. This will enable volunteers to train in subjects such as food hygiene, customer care, health and safety and safeguarding. £200 to The Bears Coaching for bubble football equipment.

£1,000 to **Boston in Bloom** for the landscaping of the raised beds next to the Police Station, within the Boston Big Local area. The beds will be filled with plants to attract pollinating insects.

£460 to Your Day Your Say, which is a day service for adults with learning difficulties. The funding will be used to help with accessibility of a growing space within Central Park.

£250 to **Kuk Sool Wan**, a Martial Arts School with students aged 5 to 65. The funding will be used towards running costs, helping to keep fees to a minimum and make classes affordable to low income families.
