Cycling Roadshow:

Free event advertised through posters (copy attached) and leaflets plus social media. BBL support publicised at event and on literature. Footfall count shows 1,023

people visited the outdoor event as spectators or participants between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. Those who registered with Get Cycling for activities were 497, excluding the junior track where registration was not essential.

Participants were primarily children/youths and parents but also some grandparents/older people. Migrant community well represented. Junior track, catering for under 7s, very busy.

Dr. Bike cycle clinic introduced this year as a new attraction. Serviced 16 bikes, some of which were in serious need of attention and in a dangerous condition. Quote from one client: "Wow! I didn't expect you to do so much". The pedal powered mega bus proved popular with visitors offering trips around the Market Place. Information on Butterfly Hospice charity ride and healthy activities handed out.

Event reported in Boston Borough Council press release with full page photographic spread also in Boston Standard. Video footage taken.

The Market Place location and its hard surface are ideally suited to the Boston Cycling Roadshow. For 2018 our preference is to retain the Cycling Roadshow as a standalone event, rather than incorporate it within the planned 2018 Active Boston event. This would help hard pressed parents who are searching for free events during the summer holidays to occupy their children.

Plans for next reporting period

- Reserve Get Cycling Roadshow for Friday 27 July 2018 (requires use of part of the BBL funding allocated to the health and wellbeing event). This would mean two BBL supported events would proceed in 2018, at no extra cost, sandwiched between the 2018 beach days.
- Continue to reserve and book attractions for the 2018 Active Boston event.
