

Boston Big Local Funding report: Boston Community Transport

Quarter 2: July - September 17

Over the last 3 months Boston Community Transport has:

- Has developed a new website, which will be going live within the next few weeks.
- Increased driver and volunteer administration staff.
- Increased membership substantially.
- Re-branded
- Taken on a new part time Co-ordinator.

Update:

Boston Community Transport has now recruited a part time Co-ordinator, employed for 20 hours over 5 days per week, Monday to Friday.

Boston Community Transport have recruited a new Trustee, who brings a wealth of experience to the board.

We have also recruited 2 new drivers, due to commence volunteering very shortly.

As you can see Boston Community Transport have implemented the new logo and the website is very near completion and will be launched within the next few weeks. We are also working on bespoke membership packs for each customer. Boston Community Transport now also have a Facebook and Twitter page, this went live in September 2017 and will help to promote us and the work we do more widely.

From 1st November 2017 Boston Community Transport are moving forwards independently without the Service Level Agreement from Lincolnshire Community Voluntary Service. Without your valued and continued funding support we would not be able to operate this essential service.

Trends and Evaluation of the Scheme:-

We are increasing membership gradually, within the BBL area and also further afield.

49 journeys within the BBL catchment area were carried out in July, 57 in August and 71 in September, showing an increase month on month, also reflected in the increase in postcode areas (shown above).

NSL has disbanded and through word of mouth, from volunteers, users and staff we have managed to increase our members due to this. Previous NSL customers now using Boston Community Transport have stated what a professional service we offer, much better than hospital transport as we do not keep them waiting for hours.

We are still focussing on continued development of marketing to promote Boston Community Transport and its benefits to local people, including BBL residents within the area.

Journeys to further afield are increasing in frequency – with transport to Nottingham, Leicester, Derby and Peterborough becoming more of a weekly occurrence.

Over 90% of our journeys are still health related, but with more publicity and awareness of the essential service we provide we are starting to increase alternative journeys, such a social clubs, hairdressers, shops and Boston College.
