## Project Progress

During this reporting period, we ran 1 multisport fun day during October half term and an extra multi-sport fun day just before Christmas.
During our October Halloween themed day, we had a lot of fun with kids encouraged to attend in fancy dress (and even the coaches got involved), with a prize being awarded for
 the best costume. We
had 13 children attend the day, during which they got to take part in sports such as Dodgeball,
 Hockey and capture the flag. The children also got to play some Halloween themed games such as Mummy Wrap and Pumpkin smash, which proved popular and provided something a bit different to our usual multi-sport games.


Following the popularity of last year's Christmas multi-sport Fun day, we decided to run an additional one again this year.
