Our 4 Themes


Theme 1 – Health and Wellbeing

Our BBL Panel meeting held at Chantry House on the Thursday Feburary 13th 2020 from 6pm.

The panel is made up of residents who can share their views and decide which projects to fund inline with our themes. Also in attendance are support members:

- A project coordinator who helps organise and put into action the residents' requests.
- A Local Trust Representative who attend each meeting to provide support and answer any questions that may arise with regards to how what we do links with the national scheme.
- A Manager from a Local Trusted Organisation who manages the contracts, the money and pays out the funding.

Only residents can vote, but the support members are valuable to the structure, ensuring all resident decisions are informed with the peace of mind that they will be actioned and fall within the Local Trust framework.

This is a very exciting time for us all at BBL because as we enter the second half of this 10-year project, we have around £500,000 remaining to invest in the area. Along with this we, the residents, have set aside around £100,000 aside potentially for a large project which you as a member of the BBL panel could help shape.
