

Reviewing the Health and Wellbeing Theme

Before starting Boston Big Local we surveyed the residents to discover the main needs of the area. The conclusion from this, and the subsequent, surveys showed the need to improve in four things. These became our four themes:

Theme 1: Improving health and wellbeing

Theme 3:
Building greater community spirit

Theme 4: Encouraging enterprise

Boston Stitchers

With your funding, our project has reached a huge amount of people and has put Boston on the map for a wider audience. It has strengthened our group and increased our membership.

It has met our expectations as we have been able to inspire many people to take part. We are able to highlight the positive aspects of Boston and present the town in an entirely unique way.

We will continue this project and complete a series of Books. We are already researching other funding streams and feel we have the necessary vision and management to take this forward.



Boston Samaritans

A huge amount of difference, your funding enabled us to deliver emotional support training in person and over Zoom during lockdown. It also helped us get out into the community to raise awareness.

It went above and beyond. Knowing we would get a regular pot of funding based on work in the community gave us a foundation on which to build.

Your funding has ensured we got out in to the local community more and we have made contacts that help ensure we are sustainable.
