- Foster interest in the New Hanse in the migrant community and foster a sense of belonging

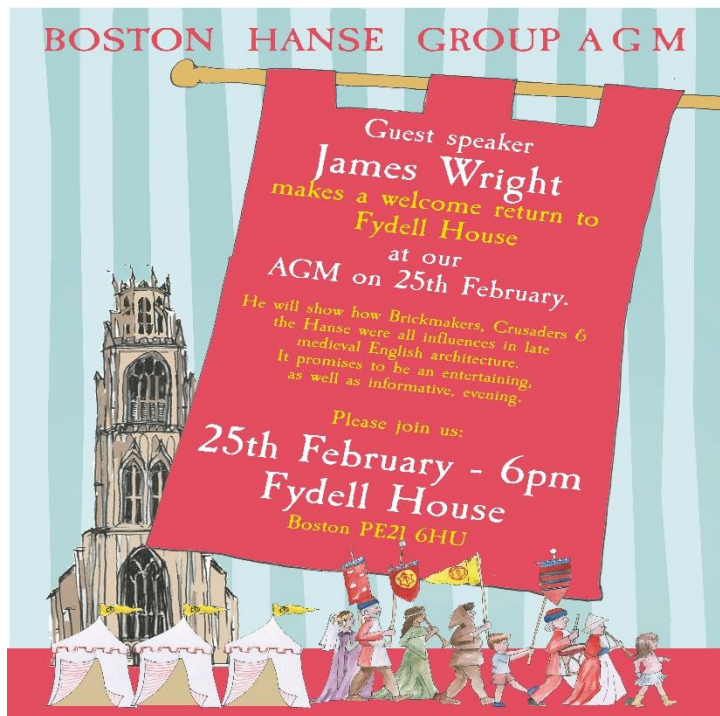
