Every four months our community chest and events panel meets to consider all funding applications. At our last meeting on the 12th January 2021 we funded the following projects:

TLCC

The Local Community Centre were looking to make their building more accessible for their users.

They requested funding of £1500 for the removal of the existing two steps at the exit and the installation of a new concrete access ramp with a safety handrail to one side of the ramp.



Are planning a small literary festival in 2021, which they hope will become an annual or biennial event. The event aims to champion the literary work done by local writers, although also hopes to involve some well-known national authors.

They requested £1500 to defray startup costs such as printing, stationery, postage, website design, and room hire.

St John Ambulance (Boston)

Their cadet programme currently costs the charity £1.1m a year to run, just £145 for each young person. They would like to continue this resource and expand and develop their programme for 2021.

They asked for an investment of £1500 to allow them to recruit, train and permit the provision of uniform to more young people in the area.

Are looking to promote tourism in Boston and run walking tours for school children and asked for £1000 to cover advertising and marketing costs.





2021 - 2023 BBL New Plan

Work on our next Plan for 2021 to 2023 has been underway since October. We have been consulting with residents and community groups over the last two years and together with hosting a series of Virtual Coffee Mornings, providing opportunities to feedback over Social Media and speaking with our Partners we are in a position to share our plans with you.

The last year has meant we haven't been able to consult with residents quite how we have done in the past and the impacts of COVID-19 has shaped our thoughts for the next two years.

We will be entering our last four years of Boston Big Local with approx. £505,000 of the original £1.199,500 investment left to spend. Our intention is to spend just over £375,000 of this in our next two years. Last year, sadly meant that we were unable to run, with Boston Borough Council, the very-popular Community Events such as the Beach and 1940s events and with the uncertainty of community gatherings going forward, we are leaving the door open for holding community events of these size when the time is right to do so.

With our minds on Legacy, and what Boston Big Local can leave in the town, our focus has moved to more fixed assets for the town, including improved play equipment and an ambitious project to move the historic Five Lamps from its current site to Central Park to be enjoyed and seen by residents and visitors alike.

We are aware of the pressures facing residents due to COVID-19 and as such we are investing in support services such as Citizens Advice Mid-Lincolnshire and Boston Samaritans. We also recognise that it is very difficult to predict what services may be needed until the recovery from the Pandemic fully starts. We are committed to being able to respond to these needs by putting aside money within each theme to quickly react to future projects once we understand fully the needs.

We will continue to provide the Community Chest and Events funding as we have done in previous Plans and look forward to receiving applications from community groups and organisations in the near future.
