And there are no words...

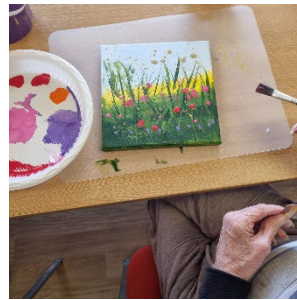
Other than...

Deb has the knack of simplifying the most complex looking painting, making the activity achievable for all.

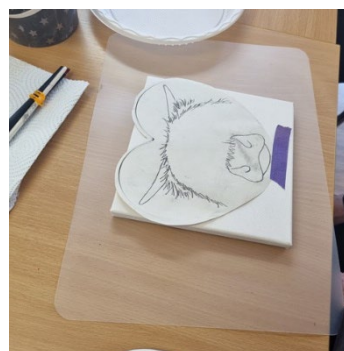
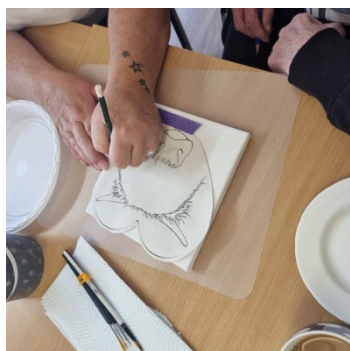






Wednesday 9th August

Please let us introduce our Highland Cows...









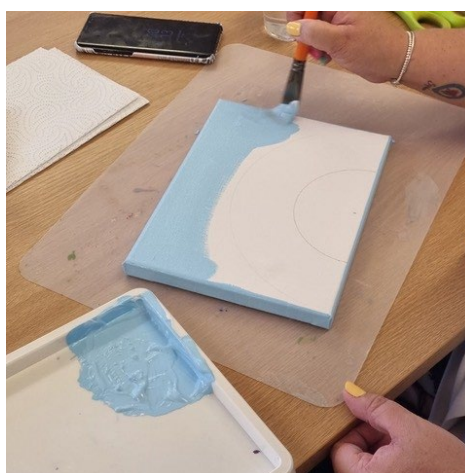
Wednesday 14th September

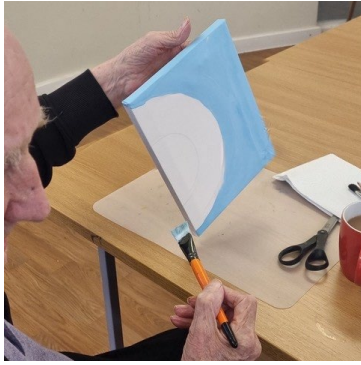
